THE STRENGTH OF **FAMILY**

When Olivia Bellamy began experiencing continuous elbow and shoulder pain in July 2017, her parents, Gene and Brandi, did what every good parent would do: they took her to a doctor. Then, they took her to another doctor...and another...and another. Seven months later, Olivia had been to nearly 50 specialists, doctors and hospitals — all with no answers.

“They did X-rays, they did MRIs...they said nothing is wrong. It’s just stress,” said Gene.

On March 2, 2018, Olivia collapsed and became unresponsive. She was rushed to the emergency room in her hometown of La Porte, IN where doctors discovered a 4” tumor on her brain. Her little body failing quickly, three-year-old Olivia was in need of advanced medical care. She was Lifelined to Riley Hospital for Children at Indiana University Health in Indianapolis, where she immediately underwent surgery to drain more than 150cc’s of fluid from her brain. Two days later, she had another surgery to remove the tumor. Though they were able to remove the tumor itself, the membrane still remained. Soon after, they received the news: Olivia had been diagnosed with a malignant embryonal tumor — an aggressive and fast-growing form of cancer.

Currently in her second round of chemotherapy, Olivia has a long road of treatments ahead of her, including several more months of chemo and surgery to correct optic nerves damaged by the tumor. Despite this, Gene and Brandi remain optimistic, citing her strength and independence. “Three days after surgery she was up and walking around,” said Gene. “She’s strong — she takes after her Daddy.”

Staying at the Ronald McDonald House has allowed the Bellamy family to be by Olivia’s side through every treatment. Though she is currently inpatient at Riley Hospital, Olivia was able to stay at the House for two weeks between treatments. During that time, her parents say that she became best friends with Mac, the House’s Chief Cheer Officer and therapy dog, and enjoyed playing with other children in the playroom.

“She didn’t want to go to bed, she didn’t want to do anything — she just wanted to be in the playroom and play! It’s good therapy for all of the kids to be able to play together, to laugh, to have a good time. She may not understand what is going on but she knows that she doesn’t feel good. [Being able to play] takes her mind off of it. It’s great,” said Gene.

The family is preparing to relocate to Indianapolis to be closer to the Riley doctors and specialists. Despite everything that’s happening, they still find time to give back — going as far as making an elaborate dinner for all of the houseguests on a night that a pre-scheduled meal group had cancelled.

“[The Ronald McDonald House] was a lifesaver. Not having to pay for a hotel that I can’t afford, being able to be close to her. If something were to happen, I can be at the hospital in just a couple of seconds. This place is a godsend for a lot of families — including mine.”
